GOALS: Students will...

- 2. Identify and apply four main types of sentences: declarative, interrogative, exclamatory, and imperative.
- 3. Apply correct usage in verb parts, tense, and agreement.
- 4. Construct paragraphs that include a topic sentence, details, and concluding sentence with appropriate transitions.
- 5. Apply the writing process and paragraph construction to a variety of essays of 5-6 paragraphs.
- 6. Consistently revise and proofread work correctly across the curriculum.
- 7. Communicate ideas effectively in a variety of genres using the Six + 1 Traits of writing: ideas, organization, voice, word choice, fluency, conventions, and presentation.
- 8. Demonstrate effective communication through presentation to peers.

- 3. Identify, explain, and apply the following parts of speech: nouns, verbs, adjectives, adverbs, pronouns, conjunctions and prepositions.
- 4. Apply grammatical concepts to add clarity to writing.
- 5. Understand and apply the elements of a paragraph: topic sentence, supporting details, explanation, transitions and concluding sentence.
- 6. Compose coherent and well-organized essays using the writing process.

- 4. Follow the writing process to develop a clear thesis with supporting, relevant details.
- 5. Revise and edit written work following suggested feedback.
- 6. Integrate research and citations using proper MLA format into a piece of writing.
- 7. Effectively communicate ideas in a clear and appropriate manner to peers through presentations.

- 4. Maintain the flow of ideas with fluid and relevant writing.
- 5. Conduct research by gathering multiple, credible sources and use MLA citation formatting.
- 6. Organize ideas to effectively communicate a thorough and well-developed answer to a prompt.
- 7. Prepare a presentation on a given topic with appropriate and relevant information.
